Explanation of the Currencies of the various Countries.

AUSTRIA AND RUSSIA.—The Paper Currencies are continually subject to important fluctuations.  
 In FRANCE, BELGIUM, SWITZERLAND, AND ITALY, 1 franc=100 centimes. GERMANY, 1 mark=100 pfennig.  
 HOLLAND, 1 florin or gulden=100 cents. NORWAY, SWEDEN, AND DENMARK, 1 kroner=100 öre. UNITED STATES, 1 dollar=100 cents. SPAIN, 1 peseta=100 centavos. AUSTRIA, 1 florin=100 kreuzer. PORTUGAL, 1 milreis=1000 reis. GREECE, 1 drachma=100 leptas. TURKEY, 1 piaster=40 paras. RUSSIA, 1 rouble=100 copecks.  
 Italian notes and silver are not current in France, Belgium, and Switzerland, but the silver of these countries passes current in Italy.

We got up late and

Went down to the  
meat market to see  
what we could get  
a quarter of beef for.  
Bought a pair of  
blankets at an auction  
sale. Chris bought a bed

Went to Sunday  
School in the  
19th Ward.

Walter went to  
the 20th, came  
home and went  
down to mail a  
letter, went from  
there to aunt's and  
had dinner.

Spent afternoon there  
and came home.

MONDAY 16.

Went to school,  
staid a little late  
for special instruction  
on drawing, came  
home had dinner  
and studied all  
day. Mrs. Goulin  
called in in the  
evening. I saw  
a kind quantity of  
Beef from Ed Super  
and it was sent to  
the house.

Wrote a letter  
to dear Mother  
asking her to  
transfer my capital  
to mother.

Studied till evening  
and went down to  
my aunt and got  
some money.  
Came up town and  
bought two pair of  
boots and 1 pair of  
pants.

WEDNESDAY 18.

Went to school  
as usual. Came  
home and copied  
my lay notes.  
In the afternoon  
went down in town  
got me five  
dollars from Mr  
Leasdale, bought  
a silver watch & gold  
chain. Went to office  
received a letter from  
C. H. Taylor, with five dollars

letter in an indignant  
manner, and sent

FRIDAY 20.

Took an examination  
in writing and my  
composition.  
William Crawford came  
up and visited us,  
staid almost with  
us. We all went to  
see Monte Cristo in  
the Theatre which  
was simply grand.  
Dance shop and went  
to bed.

JANUARY,

SATURDAY 21.

1888.

Arose very late in  
the morning.  
Jute had been down  
to Haddie's. She came  
home soon after we  
got up. Had break-  
fast, Will. & Walter  
were down in town,  
we spent the evening  
at home. Studied  
til late, and went  
to bed.

SUNDAY 22.

Got up in the mor-  
ning intending to go  
to Sunday school  
but it got too late be-  
fore I got ready.  
About 1 o'clock I  
went down to the  
Walker House and took  
a bath, from there to  
meeting, but could not get

came home and went

When I came  
home from school

about. Been on the road  
seventeen days. Saw down  
town to see about a pearl  
set, came home and  
wrote a long letter to E.

JANUARY,

WEDNESDAY 25.

1888.

Went to school  
feeling much better  
though for several  
mornings previous.  
Came home from  
school and studied  
all afternoon; then  
went down in town  
(Byrum + I) and got  
two masques, + went to  
Cunningham's to a masque  
evening party, had nice time.

THURSDAY 26.

Did not get up very  
early in the morning as  
it was late before we  
got to bed the night be-  
fore. Had breakfast +  
went to school.

This being the day for  
drawing, I was a little  
late getting home. After

He did not get up very early. Studied all day until about five o'clock when I went down to see Dunford about Hammett's teeth; from there I went down to my aunts. Gave ten dollars to John Gold for what I owed him. Went to see the "Old Cross".

## SUNDAY 5.

Went to Sunday school and after dinner, I went to meeting. Had a very good meeting and came home and wrote a letter to Hannah. Hannah & David went to the Post Office & I staid home and read over some of my old letters, then staid till bed time.

Went to school as usual, came home and tidied my books for Wednesday. Mr. Oster & I went down in town thinking there would be a theatre, but we got left and came home and looked over our lessons for the next day.

## TUESDAY 7.

Nothing more than usual & worthy of note. Studied all day and in the evening Mr. Oster, Syron, Jute and I went to see the English Opera Co. fine entertainment. Came home & staid and I sat on the back steps, telling our love stories. Went to bed about 12 o'clock.

FEBRUARY,

WEDNESDAY 8.

1888.

Arose early on account of Bookkeeping next to school and was called upon in the class & ja along alright. Yesterday I received a letter from Offie had been on the road a week. After we came home from school Mrs Oster & I went up on the hill & studied for two hours.

THURSDAY 9.

Some old routes of work nothing of importance happened. I put in nearly all of my time in Bookkeeping & Mineralogy. The weather was very fine. Mr Selley and I went up on the hill to study our lessons. We staid up there until four o'clock then came down to the house. Went to class in 17th

 no school, went down  
 in town and bought

 the pants I had gotten  
 while before. The whole

 came home and we  
 lay up on the hill  
 to shoot. came back and  
 went up to Deane's to see

THURSDAY 23.

Arose at usual hour  
 and went to school  
 Prof. Howard was sick  
 and we had no recitation  
 in Botany. Went down  
 into the laboratory and  
 studied Microscopy till  
 writing time then went  
 up and wrote awhile  
 then came home had  
 dinner, went down town  
 to get some liniment.  
 then went to see a hole in pond

MONDAY 13.

First thing this morning was to get ready to start to the Post. Mac & I went to work to get ready the grounds, the corn while I fixed the wagons. I trailed my carriage over as far as Thompson. It rained on me in Clarke Valley so I camped at Thompson.

AUGUST,

TUESDAY 14.

1888.

I hitched up this morning & started for the Park, passed some teams in the canyon, got up to the Park at noon found the boys ready to start out the range.

Told left a horse in the corral for me to ride & I went to hunt for my mare.
